

This Place Matters



The National Trust for Historic Preservation has partnered with Questers in a unique program to bring attention to their mission of historic preservation and restoration called "This Place Matters".

A Quester's chapter of Lake St. Louis, MO, the Heritage Explorers #1421, has raised over \$6,000 from fundraisers and a grant from the International Questers Organization in their efforts to help support the restoration projects of the Frenchtown Heritage Museum and Research Center, 1121 North Second Street, St. Charles, MO 63301, 636-946-8682.

This money will specifically help restore the museum's 1929 Santa Fe caboose, a work in progress, which will be used as a learning facility for children, and give visitors a look at the glory days of railroading that were once a vital part of Frenchtown's history.

The Frenchtown Heritage Museum is a research facility for those who wish to research the

history of Frenchtown. The museum is housed in a restored fire station in the heart of historic Frenchtown, St. Charles, MO. In 1991 The Frenchtown District became a National Trust Historic District.
